

By improving our intervention methods with literacy we will ensure all students are able to grow in all subjects.
Implement Common Core State Standards instructional plans that provide meaningful and rigorous learning opportunities.	Based on our Explore reading data, 20.8% of our students have met college readiness benchmarks and 17.5% have met the math college readiness benchmarks. We have a need to implement a rigorous curriculum in order to promote college and career readiness.
Maintain and nurture a positive school culture by building positive relationships with students, parents, and the community.	According to the My School My Voice survey, only 46% of parents reported feeling engaged in their school and 51% reported feeling satisfied with the school environment. Therefore, there is a need to foster stronger relationships.
