
## Mission Statement as of May 2013

Teacher committes will develop a curriculum map that will support implementation of the common core english language arts and math curriculm.	We had 54.8% of our students meeting or exceeding in reading and 64.8% in math and therefore need the rigor embedded in the common core curriculum to improve student outcomes.
Creation of continuous improvement cycle focused on school climate	My Voice, My School survey provided a score of 25 indicating that the students feel that the school is not successfully managing behavior. Unmanaged behavior disrupts classroom instruction and our goal is to have fewer disruptions to instruction in the classroom.
The attendance clerk and staff will communicate with parents and students who have multiple absences to support increased school attendance.	With a 92.78 rate of attendance, we need to consistently contact parents to ensure that they send their children to school daily.
School staff will support students in making the critical connection between learning and health.	On the School Progress Report we are reported as not being Healthy Schools Certified. Students learn from example and a healthy school will teach students to value their own health.
