
Mission Statement as of May 2013

Students will receive a high quality developmentally appropriate rigorous instructional program.	Beard does not have standardized test scores for the vast majority of it's students. Each student is assessed quarterly using the Brigance Inventory. Additional interim data consisting of teacher made assessments, student assignments, individual mastery of IEP goals, and individual skill mastery based on CCSS is used to adjust and drive instruction. All data is based on individual student progress. Multiple measures of performance are necessary to develop a comprehensive, developmentally appropriate and differentiated academic program.
We will create a positive learning environment that promotes the development of the "whole child" learning theory by providing school and community based opportunities for successful development of independent functioning skills and appropriate social/emotional skills.	All of the students at Beard have life long challenges that effect many areas of development including independent functioning and social emotional skills. Our goal is for the students to develop skills that will allow tham to be successful in the global society.
Parents and community members will work together to maintain the high quality education for the Beard School students.	All of the students at Beard have significant disabilities and face life long challenges. Parent involvement is a critical component in ensuring the successful development of the whole child. Parent meetings address the needs of the families such as specific disability information, how to advocate for your child, make and take activities that encourage learning in the home. Parents are provided an opportunity to interact with other parents and are provided learning activities they can use in the home to support their child's learning. Regular parent feedback has lead to adjustments in the focus of the parent meetings. Parents need the opportunity to network with and communite with each other. Parents have expressed a desire to establish a parent teacher organization that would provide fundraising activities and community based activities for families.
Students will have access to and utilize developmentally appropriate technology equipment and programming in order to access and support their instructional program .	Students at Beard have unique learning needs and learning styles. Strategies incorporating technology increase student interest, engagement and motivation.
