
## Mission Statement as of May 2013

To improve systems and procedures involving special education by: developing inclusive practices, strengthening collaboration between general education and special education teachers and fidelity monitoring.	Using data from the district wide snapshot, and feedback from teachers, it was determined that improvement is necessary in the areas of teacher collaboration; inclusion; and the overall implementation of special education policies and procedures.
