
Mission Statement as of May 2013

By using the Literacy Content Framework to provide rigorous instruction in literacy, all students will gain proficiency in the literacy skills that are basic to learning and critical to success in college and the workplace.
Provide reading and math interventions for Kdg 8th grade students who are at risk of academic failure as identified by fall universal screeners.	We rated ourselves a "2" in Intervention on the SEF. By improving our intervention methods we will ensure that all students who are at risk of academic failure will increase their achievement in reading and math.
Provide a supportive learning environment for all students with primary focus on Safety, Well-Being and Positive Development.	With less than 50% of the students reporting that they feel safe on the My Voice, My School Student Survey, safety needs support. By providing an orderly and secure environment, we wil promote all students' personal well-being and ensure a supportive context for learning.
