
Mission Statement as of May 2013

We need to implement consistent instructional practices across all grade levels to ensure that at least 85% of our 8th graders' score Meet/Exceed on the District-Wide Writing Prompt.
Teachers provide structured reading and mathematics interventions to students flagged on beginning of year DIBELS, TRC, and NWEA assessments and consistently monitor their progress.	We scored a "2" in "Intervention" and "Use of Time" on the School Effectiveness Framework (SEF). Improving and monitoring our intervention strategies will ensure that our struggling students make their Reading and Math growth targets.
Implement an Independent and Guided Reading program in Kindergarten-Second grade classrooms to increase students' exposures to books they can successfully read.	We must improve our students' reading abilities during the early primary grades, because only 29.8 % of Third-Fifth graders scored at/above grade level on the 2011 Scantron and 67.1% of Third-Fifth students made their growth targets last year.
