
Mission Statement as of May 2013

Increase the percentage of students who exceed in science on the ISAT	Based on last year's ISAT scores, students are further behind in science than in math or reading. 94.5% of fourth and seventh graders met standards and 36.3% exceeded in science.
Increase percent of students in grades 3-8 in Tier 4 on quarterly NWEA reading assessment.	Based on fall Scantron scores, a greater percentage of students should be in the Exceeds category. We are transferring the results of Scantron to NWEA.
