
Mission Statement as of May 2013

Haley ILT teacher leaders have not have enough time to unpack the standards in the teacher team meetings. We are emerging in the process of unpacking the CCSS and need to build instructional units that are aligned to the Common Core standards and build performance tasks that incompass the instructional shift to show what the students need to know and be able to do to show mastery of the CCSS.
Organize professional development and collaboration time for teachers to meet in order to gain information that will assist them in making the district instructional shift.	Design and provide structured professional learning opportunities that are focused on building teacher collaboration, understanding of the CCSS, analysis of data, workshops on instructional strategies and sharing student information.
Create a schoolwide intervention plan that supports students in RTI tier two and three and assists students in tier one to move from meets to exceeds.	Based on Haley ISAT scores over time 2009 -20011 we have less than 10% of our students in exceeds. The majority of Haley students fall in the meets category. Additional instructional strategies, resources and interventions are needed to move students forward. Based on Scantron data 15% are at or above grade level.
