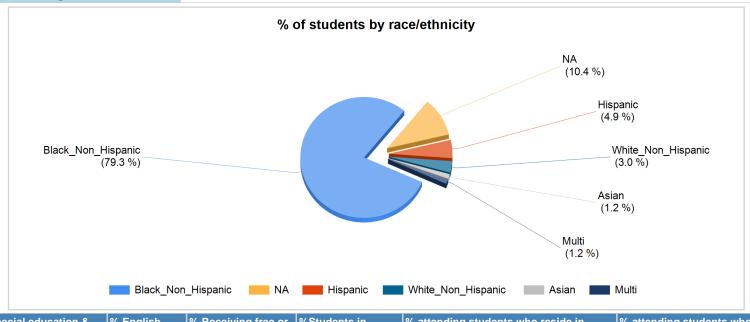
## Mission Statement as of May 2013

Implement a school-wide behaviorial support program for all students. Social and emotional supports will be provided for Tier II and Tier III to reduce disruptions, improve attendance and raise academic achievement.	A safe and nurturing environment is a major priority. 64% of the students feel safe and feels that the school successfully manages behavior. PBIS will provide incentives to promote positive behavior and maintain a safe and welcoming school.
