
Mission Statement as of May 2013

We scored our school a "3" in "Intervention" on the SEF. By continuing to enhance whole group and intervention practices we will ensure all students are able to grow in math and reading proficiency.
Utilizing the Rtl behavioral model, teachers will effectively implement CHAMPS, PBIS, and CICO as part of the school-wide culture and climate development.	As evident in rating of "3" in "Behavior and Safety" in our SEF, utilization of school-wide PBIS and upper grade CHAMPS and CICO we have seen a decline in the number of misconducts from SY11 having 73 Major Misconducts to SY12 having 22 Major Misconducts. We have a need to extend CHAMPS and CICO school-wide.
Staff proactively listens and responds to family and community concerns and engages families and community stakeholders in dialogue and activities pertaining to the improvement of educational choices for our students.	We scored our school a "2" in "Ongoing Communication" on the SEF. We have a need to improve our two-way communication between staff, parents and community.
