

The data showed most of our students were on the cusp of the next benchmark and the need to focus on non fiction text. Independent reading and writing time need to increase.
Unpack CCSS and create performance assessments and plan units that reflect the implementation of the CCSS.	Teachers understand and apply CCSS to design performance assessments, units, and effective lessons to explicitly target clear learning objectives for all students.
Implement English Language Development for ELL students	ELD will ensure greater proficiency of the English language. ISAT and Scantron results show that vocabulary and word knowledge is an area of weakness.
