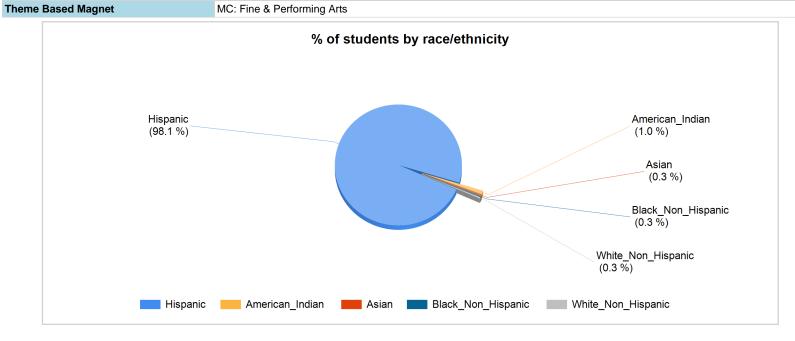
Mission Statement as of May 2013

Become experts at planning and implementing QTEL (Quality Teaching of English Language) teaching/learning stategies that focus on modeling.	Currently ony 17% of the student population exceeded the states standards in reading on the ISAT. Therefore, the Orozco teaching staff will increase their knowledge and understanding of ELL teaching strategy of modeling and providing opportunities for accountable talk across all content areas. Considering the fact that ELL's require 7-8 years of English instruction to acquire academic language, the majority of our students need more language support in all content areas. QTEL strategies provide many opportunities for shared language development.
Understand the rigor of the common core in reading and language arts, focusing on informational text and align them to complex tasks as defined by the DOK (Depth of Knowledge) levels.	Teachers will begin unit planning across all grade-levels and content areas incorporating supplemental nonfiction texts in order to prepare for the newly formatted standardized testing based on the CCSS and data obtained through the implementation of the DOK.
Actively research specific strategies and materials that will address the needs of the middle school population with an emphasis on at-risk students (in progress).
