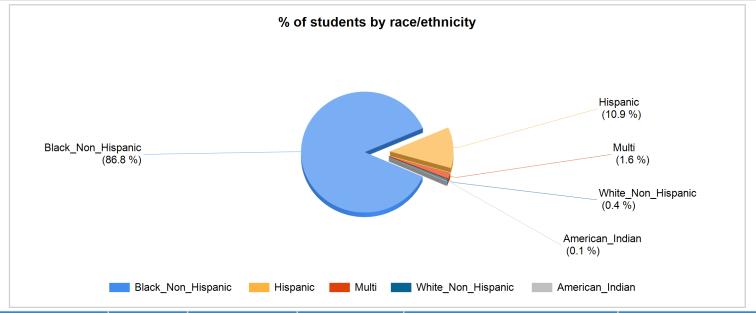
# Mission Statement as of May 2013

Teachers deliver Common Core aligned literacy and writing instructions supported by high quality appropriate texts.	We have a need to implement a rigorous curriculum as we have an average ACT score of 15. By improving our alignment to Common Core we will ensure that all students have access to a quality education.
Teachers will povide literacy and mathematics intervention and monitor progress during seminar classes to students identified on a five week cycle.	We scored our school a "2" in "Intervention" on the SEF. In addition more than 75% of our students have 1+ Ds or Fs in core subjects. By improving our intervention methods we will ensure all students are able to grow in math and reading proficiency.
Teachers will effectively use a SEL model as a part of whole school positive behavior support model.	We have a high rate of level 4-6 misconducts (5.1 per 100). In addition, we scored our school a "2" in "Behavior & Safety". We will need to improve our classroom management when increasing the rigor of our curriculum.
