
Mission Statement as of May 2013

Pirie School will increase the integration of Fine and Performing Arts into all core curriculum subject areas.	The integration of fine and performing arts enhances students' creativity, motivates students to become engaged in the learning process, and it fosters positive social and collaborative group experiences.
Pirie School will improve the student attendance to 95% and reduce the number of out of school suspensions.	Our student attendance rate has slightly decreased by less than 1% and we would like to improve in this area to meet the CPS and state attendance targets. Reducing the number of suspensions will contribute to improving our attendance rate to 95%.
Improve school partnerships with families and communities from 44% to 60% as measured by the My Voice, My School Survey.	Based on My Voice, My School surveys, concerns were expressed regarding strengthening interpersonal communication skills between parents and teachers.
Pirie School will articulate school-wide expectations for behavior that are consistently taught, modeled, and reinforced by all staff.	Based on our misconduct data, an improvement is needed in the area of social emotional learning. Improving positive student interactions will maximize instructional time for students.
