Our success will be measured by student achievement in the areas of reading and math. When expectations are not met, we will utilize different learning strategies and modify our instruction.

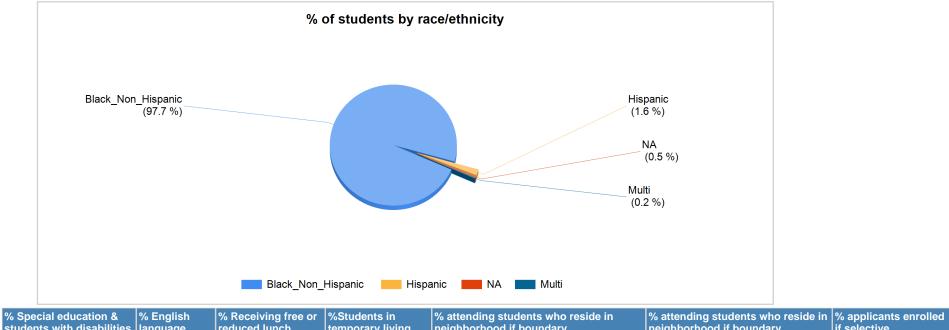
We will engage students in their own learning by using culturally relevant materials and by valuing their personal experiences.
