MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT

between

LIGHT HOUSE YOUTH CENTER

and

EDISONLEARNING, INC.

THIS MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into as of the ____day of August, 2015, by and between EDISONLEARNING, INC., a Delaware corporation ("EdisonLearning"), and LIGHT HOUSE YOUTH CENTER (the "Charter Holder"), a nonprofit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois (the "State"). EdisonLearning and the Charter Holder agree to the terms set forth below and in the appendices attached hereto and hereby incorporate them by this reference.

WHEREAS, the Charter Holder established a new charter school pursuant to the Illinois Charter Schools Law, 105 Ill. Comp. Stat. § 5/27A-1, et. seq. (the "Charter School Law");

WHEREAS, Chicago Public Schools (the "<u>District</u>" or the "<u>Chartering Authority</u>") entered into an agreement with the Charter Holder in accordance with the Charter School Law ("<u>Charter Agreement</u>") whereby the Charter Holder is authorized to operate a public charter school (the "<u>Charter School</u>");

WHEREAS, EdisonLearning offers and provides to public schools, public school districts and state education authorities certain education services based on EdisonLearning's proprietary Five Strand[®] School Design ("Five Strand Design");

WHEREAS, the Charter Holder, having carefully considered the Five Strand Design, desires that EdisonLearning implement the Five Strand Design and provide the other administrative services described in this Agreement at the Charter School;

WHEREAS, by this Agreement, EdisonLearning and the Charter Holder wish to set forth in writing all of the terms and conditions of their agreement with respect to the matters contained herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained in this Agreement and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, EdisonLearning and the Charter Holder (each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties") hereby agree as follows:

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
