Mr. Cabrera -

I am providing this letter in support of the proposed new Noble ITW campus currently planned for the Belmont-Cragin community on Chicago's far west side. As you are well aware, Chicago has long struggled to provide quality education to children on the West Side. Without quality education, economic development is all but impossible.

We believe that a new Noble ITW campus focusing on STEM curriculum will provide a needed, high-quality education option for families in the Belmont-Cragin community. Noble is committed to providing slots for students who live in the immediate vicinity of the school and Bethel will work with Noble to carve out a percentage of the total enrollment for local families.

It is anticipated that the new campus will bring a \$20 million capital investment to the community, attracting positive attention to a community that does not often receive it and helping to re-brand the community as one in which high-quality education is provided. A new campus at this location will also make positive use of vacant space, adding long-term value and progressive land use to the community. The emotional impact of this type of investment in a community that has been so long disenfranchised is both powerful and positive for the residents of the community.

It is our understanding that the construction of the new campus in 2014-2015 will create over 100 trades jobs and the completed school will provide up to 50 permanent jobs. Bethel intends to work with Noble to provide the job skills training necessary to fill their pipeline needs and to ensure that a significant number of those jobs are filled by community residents.

Additionally, the campus will feature a new soccer/football field that will add to the recreation options available to community members. We believe that the Noble ITW campus will be a welcome neighbor and will add to the overall livability of the community.

I encourage you to support the necessary zoning changes and planning modifications that may be needed to make the Noble ITW campus a reality.



Dear Chairman Cabrera:

I'm Jair Olivares, and although I'm studying a thousand miles away, my heart still lives at my home on Latrobe, a block away from the Burrito Amigo. That's why I'm writing to you today; I want to advocate for the opening of a new Noble campus. I'm more than sure that the benefits of Noble's ITW Speer Academy will reach far beyond its walls.

I am a graduate of Pritzker College Prep, a Noble campus, partially by choice, and partially because it was my only "other" option. The selective enrollment schools had chosen not to accept me, so my family and I figured Noble would be a good alternative to my neighborhood high school.

My parents were apprehensive about the neighborhood I'd be traveling to everyday, it wasn't the best neighborhood in Chicago, but I never once felt threatened while at school. Not once. Noble does an excellent job building an environment of study and community. Having high expectations for us creates a culture where you're not worried about getting beat up in the hallway or shoved into a locker. What worries you is whether or not your khakis look well-ironed, how you did on that last test, and how hard you're going to hit practice after school. Those are the kind of worries that a student should have. Noble builds character, discipline, and success.

Their biggest strength is their commitment to college. I began my high school career expecting to be a waiter, factory worker, or mechanic. Not because I thought I wasn't capable of more, but because that's what I honestly wanted in life—a simple life with a family, a home, and job that made enough money to put food on the table. College was never a real part of my plan. If it happened, it happened. If it didn't, it didn't. However, going into my junior year, there was no doubt that I would be going to college. Seeing everyone around me, students and teachers alike, present their best work inspired me to do more in life than settle for the easiest road. Not pushing myself, not striving for greatness, and not wanting to give back to my community would be a disservice.
