

We believe this key lever of Lorca's Theory of Action will impact the instructional core increasing the percentage of our K-8th students at/above grade level in reading and math and 8th graders meeting college readiness benchmarks. Grade-level teams must increase task complexity to fully prepare students for the next grade and for students to meet their growth target.
All teachers participate in learning communities: to examine teacher practice and share instructional strategies; to do a deep dive into multiple sources of student data (grade-level assessment, standardized data, etc.) every quarter; to refine their skills as an educator.	Lorca received an average score for ambitious instruction on the 2011 "My Voice, My School" survey indicating the urgency for teachers to identify gaps in learning, implement specific strategies and interventions to address the needs of all students. Teachers will increase their knowledge of Bloom's Taxonomy, balanced literacy and literacy skills needed in technical subjects. All will benefit from the additional resources, tools, and best practices to become effective teachers.
Administrators and ILT complete instructional rounds, analyze schoolwide data, indicators of success, and continually reflect on Theory of Action to establish an optimal learning environment for all stakeholders.	Lorca received an average score for involved families and supportive environment on the 2011 "My Voice, My School" survey. Lorca students also reported only average for safety, academic personalism, and academic press. We believe we will increase parental involvement and promote student safety by establishing a positive school culture and implementation of health & wellness program.
