
Mission Statement as of May 2013

Description	Rationale
Grade Level Teams develop theme based, Common Core aligned units of instruction and rigorous performance tasks that use grade appropriate complex texts.	Our school scored a number "2" in "Curriculum" on the SEF. By aligning our curriculum to the CCSS we will be able to implement a rigorous literacy curriculum. We now have only 53% in literacy meeting growth targets on the NWEA in literacy for all grades.
Increase student achievement of all English Language Learners by strengthening the Tier 1 instruction in order to provide continuity in language and content knowledge development.	We have a need to strengthen the ELL curriculum as we are not making AYP assessment targets. In 2011, the percentage of LEP students meeting/exceeding standards was 34.3% in reading. In addition only 12% of the ELL students exited the Bilingual Program in 2011.
The school will adopt of a school wide writing strategy (MEL-Con) in order to support writing across all grade levels, extended response on ISAT and argumentative writing as part of the CCSS.	ISAT data indicates that the majority of our students are scoring a "2" on the extended response reading test. Mel-Con will provide a structured and consistent approach to writing evidence based arguments school wide.
