
Mission Statement as of May 2013

This will be evidenced by individual student growth on IEP goals, school wide summative assessment scores and Illinois Alternative Assessment scores.
We will continue to enhance the transition plan on each student's IEP and individual goals that target post-secondary education/training, post-secondary employment, and independent living.	All students at Vaughn have Intellectual Disabilities, therefore college is not typically an option. Although we had scored a "3" in the areas of Transitions, College & Career Assessments, High expectations & College going culture and College & Career exploration and election, we scored a "2" in College & Career Admissions and Affordability. By continuing to provide formal and informal information about post secondary options and continous improvement in the student's IEP and transition plan, more students will be exposed to the various resources available to them for transitioning.
We will provide ongoing community-based instruction focusing on the climate in our school, behavior of our students inside and outside of school, collaboration with outside agencies, and ongoing interaction with non-disabled peers.
