Harold Washington Elementary School collaborates with all stakeholders to empower students to be self-directed college and career ready graduates.

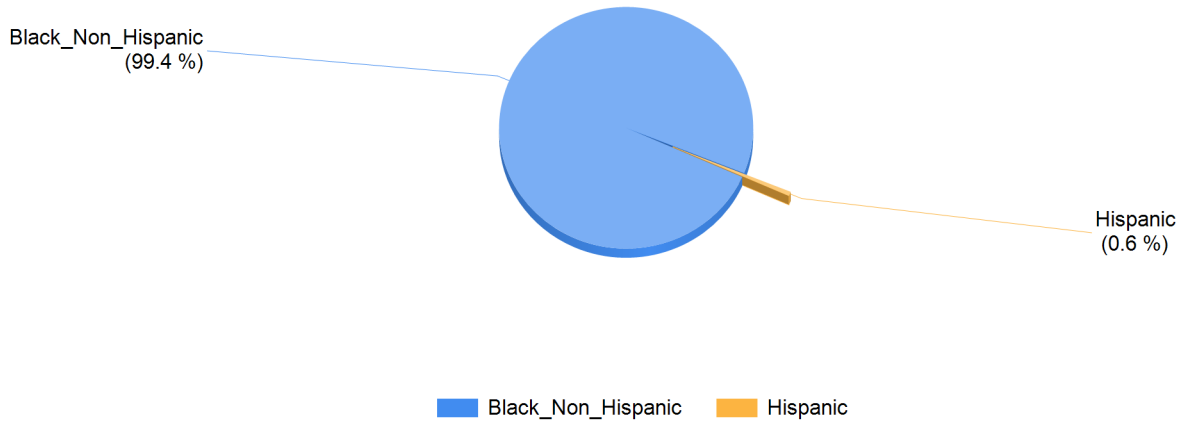
School Priorities as of May 2013
