Established as a charter school by the Chicago Public Schools in 1997, today YCCS serves over 4000 high school students at 20 neighborhood campuses. As of 2013, over 15,000 students have graduated from YCCS who, prior to enrollment, were off-track in credits or had dropped out of their neighborhood high school. Across its educational sites, YCCS has an average senior graduation rate of 86%, of which 76% go onto post-secondary education or full-time employment—certainly an impressive statistic for any high school.

SUBJECT: CONFLICT OF INTEREST – BOARD MEMBERS

POLICY NUMBER:

SECTION: HUMAN RESOURCES

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EFFECTIVE: NOVEMBER 5, 2003

REVISED: JULY 28, 2011

APPROVAL: YCCS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

PURPOSE:

To establish a policy and guidelines for Youth Connection Charter School (YCCS) board members so that they may avoid situations that might constitute or be perceived to constitute a conflict of interest.

POLICY:

Youth Connection Charter School board members are expected to maintain high standards of professional and business integrity and to avoid situations that might cause embarrassment to the organization or pose a conflict between the interests of Youth Connection Charter School and that of the individual board members.

Board members who determine that there may be an actual or potential conflict of interest situation are expected to report it to the Board President and to the Chairperson of the YCCS Board Personnel Committee.

The following guidelines include, but are not all inclusive of, those situations that may pose a conflict of interest between the board member and YCCS:

1. A board member who works for any direct consulting firm, vendor, funding source, or direct competitor of YCCS.
2. A board member who accepts a fee or compensation of any value for performing his or her duties on behalf of YCCS from any source other than YCCS.
3. A board member who accepts for himself, herself or for family members or others, any gifts, favors, entertainment, goods, services, or other benefits under circumstances that might be construed as influencing the performance of his or her responsibilities.

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4. A board member who has sex with a YCCS client or client family member.
5. A board member who uses YCCS assets or labor for personal use. A board member who uses one's position or any information obtained during their board tenure with YCCS to create an unfair, unethical, or improper competitive advantage for self or others.
6. A board member who does not disclose relevant relationships between themselves and other board members or YCCS employees at the time of appointment to the Board of Directors or subsequent to their appointment.
7. A board member who has a relative employed at YCCS. Relatives are defined as husband, wife, aunts, uncles, children, grandchildren, grandparents, in-laws, nieces, nephews, siblings, stepchildren, significant other, cousins, as well as persons living in the same household (i.e. the same address) of a current board member.
8. A board member, relative of a board members, staff person, or relative of a staff person, who attempts to enter into a contract for services/goods with YCCS. Contracts for services/goods with YCCS and a board member, relative of a board member, staff person, or relative of a staff person is strongly discouraged. The Board of Directors must approve any exception.
